Understanding the Impacts of Climate Change on Boreal Wetlands

Ducks Unlimited Canada, in collaboration with Western University, the National Center for Atmospheric Research, and Athabasca University, is developing a computer model to create a future map of wetlands. This map will show how climate change may impact wetlands across the western part of the boreal forest by identifying areas where wetlands may be lost or gained in the future. This could help identify wetlands that may be at risk of loss due to climate change and inform stewardship actions or climate change adaptation planning.

We're looking for input on what kind of information would be helpful to you as you work to understand, plan for, monitor, or adapt to climate change impacts on wetlands. Survey responses will be summarized and shared with the project team. Individual responses will not be identifiable.



SUMMARY OF DUTIES:

Responsible to the First Nation, through the Consultation Manager, First Nation Site Assessment (SA) Technician acts in a supportive role facilitating site assessments for Kapawe'no First Nation. The FN SA Technician will be guided by the Site Assessment Handbook adopted by KFN from ICRCC (Appendix A-2 attached), and report directly to the Consultation Manager for day-to-day tasks. More specifically, the FN SA Technician summary of duties will include: mapping projects manually and digitally, arranging and conducting site assessments, responsible for all equipment care and maintenance, maintaining the yard and supplies, maintaining documentation records for the same.
